The endoplasmic reticulum is found in most eukaryotic cells and forms an interconnected network of flattened, membrane-enclosed sacs known as cisternae (in the RER), and tubular structures in the SER. It is a type of organelle made up of two subunits – rough endoplasmic reticulum (RER), and smooth endoplasmic reticulum (SER). The endoplasmic reticulum is not found in red blood cells, or spermatozoa. The membranes of the ER are continuous with the outer nuclear membrane c16229d958

Anthrax toxin Anthrax toxin is composed of a cell-binding protein, known as protective antigen (PA), and two enzyme components, called edema factor (EF) and lethal factor (LF). Assembled complexes containing the toxin components are endocytosed. The mechanism of anthrax toxin action is the result of the molecular structures of the three toxin Anthrax toxin is a three-protein exotoxin secreted by virulent strains of the bacterium, *Bacillus anthracis*—the causative agent of anthrax. The toxin may even induce cell lysis, as is. The toxin was first discovered by Harry Smith in 1954. These three protein components act together to impart their physiological effects. proteins to enter the cell and disrupt cellular function. Once in the cytosol, the enzymatic components of the toxin disrupt various immune cell functions, namely cellular signaling and cell migration. In the endosome, the enzymatic components of the toxin translocate into the cytoplasm of a target cell c16229d958
