Phenomenology (philosophy) It attempts to describe the universal features of consciousness while avoiding assumptions about the external world, aiming to describe phenomena as they appear, and to explore the meaning and significance of lived experience. different branches of phenomenology may be seen as representing different philosophies despite sharing the common foundational approach of phenomenological Phenomenology is a philosophical study and movement largely associated with the early 20th century that seeks to objectively investigate the nature of subjective, conscious experience

Some psychometric researchers focus on the construction and validation of assessment instruments Psychometrics is a field of study within psychology concerned with the theory and technique of measurement. The levels of individuals on nonobservable latent variables are inferred through mathematical modeling based on what is observed from individuals' responses to items on tests and scales. Psychometrics is concerned with the objective measurement of latent constructs

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that cannot be directly observed.

Psychometrics generally covers specialized fields within psychology and education devoted to testing, measurement, assessment, and related activities
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Matter In everyday as well as scientific usage, matter generally includes atoms and anything made up of them, and any particles (or combination of particles) that act as if they have both rest mass and volume. These include classical everyday phases such as solid, liquid, and gas – for example water exists as ice, liquid water, and gaseous steam – but other states are possible, including. All everyday objects that can be touched are ultimately composed of atoms, which are made up of interacting subatomic particles. Matter exists in various states (also known as phases). However it does not include massless particles such as photons, or other energy phenomena or waves such as light or heat. bind them together, leading to the next definition. Educational inequality Educational Inequality is the unequal distribution of academic resources, including but not limited to school funding, qualified and experienced teachers Educational Inequality is the unequal distribution of academic resources, including but not limited to school funding, qualified and experienced teachers, books, physical facilities and technologies, to socially excluded communities. Inequality leads to major differences in the educational success or efficiency of these individuals and ultimately suppresses social and economic mobility. These communities tend to be historically disadvantaged and oppressed. Inequality in education is broken down into different types: regional inequality, inequality by sex, inequality by social stratification, inequality by parental.

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Individuals belonging to these marginalized groups are often denied access to schools with adequate resources and those that can be accessed are so distant from these communities 23f8a2d71a

The term has come to be used for a specific area of graphic design related to displaying information effectively, rather than just attractively or for artistic expression. Most available data underestimate crime before the 1930s (due to incomplete datasets and other factors), giving the false impression that crime was low in the early 1900s and had a sharp rise after. Instead, violent crime during the colonial period was likely three times higher than the highest modern rates in the data currently available, and crime had been on the decline since colonial times. the homicide rate chart under the “Homicide” heading of the International comparison section. After 1992, crime rates have generally trended downwards each year, with the exceptions of a slight increase in property crimes. Communitarianism It also emphasizes Communitarianism is a philosophy that emphasizes the connection between the individual and the community. Communitarianism is often contrasted with individualism, and generally opposes laissez-faire policies that deprioritize the stability of the overall community. Its overriding philosophy is based on the belief that a person's social identity and personality are largely molded by community relationships, with a smaller degree of development being placed on individualism. Although the community might be a family,

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communitarianism usually is understood, in the wider, philosophical sense, as a collection of interactions, among a community of people in a given place (geographical location), or among a community who share an interest or who share a history. of society and its institutions above and beyond that of the state and the market, which are often the focus of other political philosophies 23f8a2d71a
