George Gamow He was an early advocate and developer of Georges Lemaître's Big Bang theory. Gamow was a key figure in the development and understanding of quantum tunneling. Gamow discovered a theoretical explanation of alpha decay by quantum tunneling, invented the liquid drop model (the first mathematical model of the atomic nucleus), worked on radioactive decay, star formation, stellar nucleosynthesis, Big Bang

nucleosynthesis (which he collectively called nucleocosmogogenesis), and predicted the existence of the cosmic microwave background radiation and molecular genetics. Although the concept of biology as a single coherent field arose in the 19th century, the biological sciences emerged from traditions of medicine and natural history reaching back to Ayurveda, ancient Egyptian medicine and the works of Aristotle, Theophrastus and Galen in the ancient Greco-Roman world.
