Rerun was a minor character in the strip when he was introduced in 1972. In the 1980s, he mostly appeared in sequences riding on the back of his mother's bicycle. However, in the late 1990s (the final years of the strip) he became a major presence, as Schulz felt that his main cast was "too old" for some of the themes he wanted to explore. In a 1997 interview in Comics Journal, Schulz admitted, "Lately, Rerun has almost taken over the strip." fe784d4fde
