Shakespeare in performance Both approaches have influenced the variety of Shakespearean production styles seen today. Among the actors of these original performances were Richard Burbage (who played the title role in the first performances of Hamlet, Othello, Richard III and King Lear), Richard Cowley, and William Kempe. The troupe for which Shakespeare wrote Millions of performances of William Shakespeare's plays have been staged since the end of the 16th century. Some of the roles in Shakespeare's plays were likely played by Shakespeare himself. Tragedy Traditionally, the intention of tragedy is to invoke an accompanying catharsis, or a "pain [that] awakens pleasure," for the audience. While many cultures have developed forms that provoke this paradoxical response, the term tragedy often refers to a specific tradition of drama that has played a unique and important role historically in the self-definition of Western civilization. In his essay "Hegel's Theory of Tragedy," A. That tradition has been multiple and discontinuous, yet the term has often been used to invoke a powerful effect of cultural identity and historical continuity—"the Greeks and the Elizabethans, in one cultural form; Hellenes and Christians, in a common activity,". King Lear Regan and Goneril subsequently break promises to host Lear and his entourage, so he opts to become homeless and destitute, and goes insane. It is loosely based on the legendary Welsh figure Leir of Britain. She instead offers the respect of a daughter and is disowned by Lear who seeks flattery. The King's third daughter, Cordelia, is offered a third of his kingdom also, but refuses to be insincere in her praise and affection.
