The fundamental objects of study in algebraic geometry are algebraic varieties, which are geometric manifestations of solutions of systems of polynomial equations. Examples of the most studied classes of algebraic varieties are lines, circles, parabolas, ellipses, hyperbolas, cubic curves like elliptic curves, and quartic curves like lemniscates and Cassini ovals. A natural number greater than 1 that is not prime is called a composite number. abstract algebra, objects that behave in a generalized way like prime numbers include prime elements and prime ideals. A natural number (1, 2, 3, 4, 5 A prime number (or a prime) is a natural number greater than 1 that is not a product of two smaller natural numbers. However, 4 is composite because it is a product (2×2) in which both numbers are smaller than 4. Primes are central in number theory because of the fundamental theorem of arithmetic: every natural number greater than 1 is either a prime itself or can be factorized as a product of primes that is unique up to their order
