Winchester Medical College More specifically, it was in retaliation for the desecration they discovered of one of those cadavers, the body of one of John Brown's sons, identified years later as Watson. The body of John Brown's son, fighting against slavery in the raid on Harpers Ferry, had been dishonored: made into an anatomical specimen in the College's museum, with the label "Thus always with Abolitionists" (mirroring Thus Always to Tyrants, the motto of the Commonwealth of Virginia). The physician Lewis Sayre wrote Governor Wise before the execution suggesting that Brown's body be given The Winchester Medical College (WMC) building, currently located at 302 W.
