Research A research project may be an expansion of past work in the field. It involves the collection, organization, and analysis of evidence to increase understanding of a topic, characterized by a particular attentiveness to controlling sources of bias and error. To test the validity of instruments, procedures, or experiments, research may replicate elements of prior projects or the project as a whole. The term is generally associated with experiments in which the design introduces conditions that directly

affect the variation, but may also refer to the design of quasi-experiments, in which natural conditions that influence the variation are selected for observation b53db4f40f

Blocking (statistics) The roots of blocking originated from the statistician, Ronald Fisher, following his development of ANOVA. However, the different methods share the same purpose: to control variability introduced by specific factors that could influence the outcome of an experiment. These variables are chosen carefully to minimize the effect of their variability on

the observed outcomes. interpretation between the independent and dependent variables. There are different ways that blocking can be implemented, resulting in different confounding effects.

To address nuisance variables, researchers can employ different methods such as blocking or randomization In the statistical theory of the design of experiments, blocking is the arranging of experimental units that are similar to one another in groups (blocks) based on one or more variables b53db4f40f
