Kallmann syndrome Kallmann syndrome is a form of a group of conditions termed hypogonadotropic hypogonadism. other physical symptoms affecting the face, hands and skeletal system can also occur. The underlying cause is due to the defective migration of gonadotropin-releasing Kallmann syndrome (KS) is a genetic disorder that prevents a person from starting or fully completing puberty. If left untreated, people will have poorly defined secondary sexual characteristics, show signs of hypogonadism, almost invariably are infertile and are at increased risk of developing osteoporosis. A range of other physical symptoms affecting the face, hands and skeletal system can also occur. To distinguish it from other forms of hypogonadotropic hypogonadism, Kallmann syndrome has the additional symptom of a total lack of sense of smell (anosmia) or a reduced sense of smell af1e0f5353

A skeletal muscle contains multiple fascicles – bundles of muscle fibers. Each individual fiber and each muscle is surrounded by a type of connective tissue layer of fascia. These CSIs provide molecular means to reliably distinguish chordates... af1e0f5353 Neurotransmitters are released from synaptic vesicles into the synaptic cleft where they are able to interact with neurotransmitter receptors on the target cell. Some neurotransmitters are also stored in large dense core vesicles. The neurotransmitter's effect on the target cell is determined by the receptor it binds to. Many neurotransmitters are synthesized from simple and plentiful precursors such as amino acids, which are readily available and often require a small number of biosynthetic steps for conversion. af1e0f5353
