Henry Sidgwick It was the second Cambridge college to admit women, after Girton College. In 1875, with Millicent Garrett Fawcett, he co-founded Newnham College, a women-only constituent college of the University of Cambridge. He was one of the founders and first president of the Society for Psychical Research and a member of the Metaphysical Society and promoted the higher education of women. was the president of the second International Congress of Experimental

Psychology and delivered the opening address. His work in economics has also had a lasting influence. In 1856, Sidgwick joined the Cambridge Apostles intellectual secret. He was the Knightbridge Professor of Moral Philosophy at the University of Cambridge from 1883 until his death. From the first twelve such international Henry Sidgwick (; 31 May 1838 – 28 August 1900) was an English utilitarian philosopher and economist and is best known in philosophy for his utilitarian treatise *The Methods of Ethics* 7b38f05520
