Words of estimative probability A well-chosen WEP gives a decision maker a clear and unambiguous estimate upon which to base a decision. An ineffective WEP places the decision maker in the role of the analyst, increasing the likelihood of poor or snap decision making. discipline of intelligence analysis addressed the problem of misleading expressions of odds in National Intelligence Estimates (NIE). Some intelligence and policy failures appear to be related to the imprecise use of estimative words. In Words of Estimative Words of estimative probability (WEP or WEPs) are terms used by intelligence analysts in the production of analytic reports to convey the likelihood of a future event occurring.
