While used broadly throughout history, land grabbing as used in the 21st century primarily refers to large-scale land acquisitions following the 2007–08 world food price crisis. Obtaining water resources is usually critical to the land acquisitions, so it has also led to an associated trend of water grabbing. By prompting food security fears within the developed world and newfound economic opportunities for agricultural investors, the food price crisis caused a dramatic spike in large-scale agricultural investments, primarily foreign, in the Global South for the purpose of industrial food and biofuels production.

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Intensive farming characterized by loss of forage and decreased animal carrying capacity which results from overgrazing, poor nutrient management, and lack of soil conservation Intensive agriculture, also known as intensive farming (as opposed to extensive farming), conventional, or industrial agriculture, is a type of agriculture, both of crop plants and of animals, with higher levels of input and output per unit of agricultural land area. It is characterized by a low fallow ratio, higher use of inputs such as capital, labour, agrochemicals and water, and higher crop yields per unit land area

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Agriculture Agriculture was a key factor in the rise of sedentary human civilization, whereby farming of domesticated plants and animals created food surpluses that enabled people to live in the cities. agribusiness, trade lobbies and other groups. While humans started gathering grains at least 105,000 years ago, nascent farmers only began planting them around 11,500 years ago. Broader definitions also include forestry and aquaculture. Plants were independently cultivated in at least 11 regions of the world. Sheep, goats, pigs, and cattle were domesticated around 10,000 years ago. In the 20th century, industrial agriculture based on large-scale monocultures came to dominate agricultural output. In a global context, world GDP and world GNI are, Gross domestic product (GDP) is a monetary measure of the total market value of all the final goods and services produced and rendered in a specific time period by a country or countries. However, GDP is not a measure of overall standard of living or well-being, as it does not account for how income is distributed among the population. A country may rank high in GDP but still experience jobless. The major components of GDP are consumption, government spending, net exports (exports minus imports), and investment. For example, population growth through mass immigration can raise consumption and demand for public services, thereby contributing to GDP growth. GDP is often used to measure the economic activity of a country or region. that GDP defines its scope according to location, while GNI defines its scope according to ownership

biophysical environments and to ecosystems, biodiversity, and natural resources caused directly or indirectly by humans. Modifying the environment to fit the needs of society (as in the built environment) is causing severe effects including global warming, environmental degradation (such as ocean acidification), mass extinction and biodiversity loss, ecological crisis, and ecological collapse. Some human activities that cause damage (either directly or indirectly) to the environment on a global scale include population growth, neoliberal economic policies and rapid economic growth, overconsumption, overexploitation, pollution, and deforestation.
