In those cases, freedom In United States constitutional law, false statements of fact are assertions, which are ostensibly facts, that are false. Often, this is due to laws against defamation, that is making statements that harm the reputation of another. Because it is almost impossible for someone to be absolutely sure that what they say (in public) is true, a party who makes a false claim isn't always liable. The standards of such protection have evolved over time from a body of Supreme Court rulings. Such statements are not always protected by the First Amendment. Whether such speech is protected depends on the situation. Often, this is due to laws against defamation, that is making statements that harm the reputation of another dfc1643e6b

The Supreme Court has extended most, but not all, rights of the Fifth Amendment to the state and local levels. This means that neither the federal, state, nor local governments may deny people rights protected by the Fifth Amendment. The Court furthered most protections of this amendment through the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment. dfc1643e6b The Eighteenth Amendment was the product of decades of efforts by the temperance movement, which held that a ban on the sale of alcohol would ameliorate poverty and other societal problems. The Eighteenth Amendment was repealed by the Twenty-first Amendment on December 5, 1933, making it the only constitutional amendment in American history to be repealed. The amendment was proposed by Congress on December 18, 1917, and ratified by the requisite number of states on January 16, 1919 dfc1643e6b

It clarifies that the vice president becomes president if the president dies, resigns, or is removed from office by impeachment. It also establishes the procedure for filling a vacancy in the office of the vice president. Additionally, the amendment provides for the temporary transfer of the president's powers and duties to the vice president, either on the president's initiative alone or on the initiative of the vice president together with a majority of the president's cabinet. Twelfth Amendment to the United States Constitution The Twelfth Amendment (Amendment XII) to the United States Constitution provides the procedure for electing the president and vice president. The amendment was proposed by Congress on December 9, 1803, and was ratified by the requisite three-quarters of state legislatures on June 15, 1804. It replaced the procedure in Article II, Section 1, Clause 3, under which the Electoral College originally functioned. The new rules took effect for the 1804 presidential election and have governed all subsequent presidential elections.
