Polis : poleis) means 'city' in Ancient Greek. Ancient Greece was not a sovereign country, but was territory occupied by Hellenes, people who claimed as their native language some dialect of Ancient Greek. It had a constitution and demanded the supreme loyalty of its citizens. In ancient Greece, the polis was the native land; there was no other. The ancient word polis had socio-political connotations not possessed by modern usage. For example, Modern Greek πόλη (polē) is located within a χώρα (khôra), "country", which is a πατρίδα (patrida) or "native land" for its citizens. χώρα was only the countryside, not a country. These ranged from the Caucasus to Southern Spain, and from Southern Russia to Northern Egypt, spread Polis (pl. Classical ancient-Greek-speaking
