These therapies combine experiential therapy techniques, including person-centered and Gestalt therapies, with systemic therapy and attachment theory. The goals of treatment include transforming maladaptive behaviors, such as emotional avoidance, and developing awareness, acceptance, expression, and regulation of emotion and understanding of relationships. Chaos theory discusses self-organization in terms of islands of predictability in a sea of chaotic unpredictability. As such, the organization is typically robust and able to survive or self-repair substantial perturbation. The resulting organization is wholly decentralized, distributed over all the components of the system. 2008–2009, a concept of guided self-organization started to take shape. It is often triggered by seemingly random fluctuations, amplified by positive feedback.
