Mikhail Bakhtin (4 November 1895 – 7 March 1975) was a Russian philosopher and literary critic who worked on the philosophy of language, ethics, and literary theory. His writings, on a variety of subjects, inspired scholars working in a number of different traditions (Marxism, semiotics, structuralism, religious criticism) and in disciplines as diverse as literary criticism, history, philosophy, sociology, anthropology and psychology. S. wrote (see below). Although Bakhtin was active in the debates on aesthetics and literature that took place in the Soviet Union in the 1920s, his distinctive position did not become well known until he was rediscovered by Russian scholars in the 1960s. Australian English In contrast with American English Australian English (AusE, AusEng, AuE, AuEng, en-AU) is the set of varieties of the English language native to Australia. The American English defense and offense are spelt defence and offence in Australian English. It is also the main language used in compulsory education, as well as federal, state and territorial legislatures and courts. While Australia has no official language, English is the first language of the majority of the population, and has been entrenched as the de facto national language since the onset of British settlement, being the only language spoken in the home for 72% of

This situation is even more problematic within CMC, since the jargon of the medium is dominated by English terms Internet slang (also called Internet shorthand, cyber-slang, netspeak, digispeak or chatspeak) is a non-standard or unofficial form of language used by people on the Internet to communicate to one another. Such terms often originate with the purpose of saving keystrokes or to compensate for character limit restrictions. However, it can be understood to be any type of slang that Internet users have popularized, and in many cases, have coined. Many people use the same abbreviations in texting, instant messaging, and social networking websites. Acronyms, keyboard symbols, and abbreviations are common types of Internet slang. Since Internet slang is constantly changing, it is difficult to provide a standardized definition 565ddd7ce3
