Thriller film The suspense element found in most films' plots is particularly exploited by the filmmaker in this genre. Thriller film, also known as suspense film or suspense thriller, is a broad film genre that evokes excitement and suspense in the audience. Tension is created by delaying what the audience sees as inevitable, and is built through situations that are menacing or where escape seems impossible.

Both the series and the titular character were named after Tex Avery, an animator who is known for his work at Warner Bros., MGM and Walter Lantz Productions, who had died in 1980, seventeen years before the series' debut. The creator describes the show as "a homage to the brilliant, hilarious and groundbreaking animator Tex Avery and the wonderful squash-and-stretch cartoons of his era". The series was first broadcast on the French channel M6 on September 3, 1997 and later debuted in syndication in the United States on September 29, ending after a single season on November 30 that same year. In the following years since it debuted, *The Wacky World of Tex Avery* has received overwhelmingly negative reviews and has been described as an "insult" to its namesake's legacy. It was only a minimal hit in international territories where Tex Avery's actual works were lesser-known.

Crime Fiction came to be recognised as a distinct literary genre, with specialist writers and a devoted readership, in the 19th century. Earlier novels and stories were typically devoid of systematic attempts at detection: There was a detective, whether amateur or professional, trying to figure out how and by whom a particular crime was committed; there were no police trying to solve a case; neither was there any discussion of motives, alibis, the modus operandi, or any of the other elements which make up the modern crime writing.
