Electrical equipment in hazardous areas Standards and regulations exist to identify such locations, classify the hazards, and design equipment for safe use in such locations. publishes analogous standards in RP 500 and RP505. Electrical equipment installed in such locations can provide an ignition source, due to electrical arcing, or high temperatures. NFPA 70, the National Electrical Code (NEC), defines area classification and installation principles In electrical and safety engineering, hazardous locations (HazLoc, pronounced haz·lōk) are places where fire or explosion hazards

The building code becomes law of a particular jurisdiction when formally enacted by the appropriate governmental or private authority. The main purpose of building codes is to protect public health, safety and general welfare as they relate to the construction and occupancy of buildings and structures—for example, the building codes in many countries require engineers to consider the effects of soil liquefaction in the design of new buildings aa288be347

The injury depends on the density of the current, tissue resistance and duration of contact. Very small currents may be imperceptible or only produce a light tingling sensation. However, a shock caused by low and otherwise harmless current could startle an individual and cause injury due to jerking away or falling. A strong electric shock can often cause painful muscle spasms severe enough to dislocate joints or even to break bones. The loss of muscle control is the reason that a person may be unable to release themselves from the electrical source; if this happens at a height as on a power line they can be thrown off. Morse code Morse's preliminary proposal for a telegraph code was replaced by an alphabet-based code developed by Alfred Vail, the engineer working with Morse; it was Vail's version that was used for commercial telegraphy in North America. Morse code is named after Samuel Morse, one of several developers of the code system. seven time units (formerly five) Morse code can be transmitted in a number of ways: Originally as electrical pulses along a telegraph

wire, but later Morse code is a telecommunications method which encodes text characters as standardized sequences of two different signal durations, called dots and dashes, or dits and dahs. Friedrich Gerke was another substantial developer; he simplified Vail's code to produce the code adopted in Europe, and most of the alphabetic part of the current international (ITU) "Morse" is copied from Gerke's revision aa288be347
