Pulitzer Prize for Editorial Writing Thus it is one of the original Pulitzers, for the program was inaugurated in 1917 with seven prizes, four of which were awarded that year. It has been awarded since 1917 for distinguished editorial writing, the test of excellence being clearness of style, moral purpose, sound reasoning, and power to influence public opinion in what the writer conceives to be the right direction. The program has also recognized opinion journalism with its Pulitzer Prize for Editorial Cartooning from 1922. Tallahassee bus boycott Steele began talks with city authorities while the local Black community started boycotting the city's buses. The campaign lasted from May 26, 1956, to December 22, 1956, and contributed to the broader civil rights movement in the United States. spokespersons, Gladys Harrington was its secretary. The boycott began when Wilhelmina Jakes and Carrie Patterson, two Florida A&M University students, were arrested by the Tallahassee Police Department for "placing themselves in a position to incite a riot". K. C. Daisy Young provided clerical services for the ICC and served as a link between the FAMU campus and the The Tallahassee bus boycott was a political and social protest campaign against the policy of racial segregation on the public transit system of Tallahassee, Florida. Bland was pulled over for a traffic violation on July 10 by State Trooper Brian Encinia. The exchange escalated, resulting in Bland's arrest and a charge of assaulting a police officer.
