Daniel Clowes Daniel Gillespie Clowes (/klaʊz/; born April 14, 1961) is an American cartoonist, graphic novelist, illustrator, and screenwriter. With filmmaker Terry Zwigoff, Clowes adapted *Ghost World* into a 2001 film and another *Eightball* story into the 2006 film, *Art School Confidential*. Clowes's illustrations have appeared in *The New Yorker*, *Newsweek*, *Vogue*, *The Village Voice*, and elsewhere. An *Eightball* issue typically contained several short pieces and a chapter of a longer narrative that was later collected and published as a graphic novel,

such as *Like a Velvet Glove Cast in Iron* (1993), *Ghost World* (1997), *David Boring* (2000) and *Patience* (2016).
