Kill Doctor Lucky is, in concept, a sort of inversion and perhaps a parody of Cluedo (Clue in North America). Cluedo begins after the murder has been committed, and players compete to solve it; Kill Doctor Lucky ends with the murder, and players compete to commit it. == Married life == The Titanic has been commemorated in a wide variety of ways in the century after she sank in the North Atlantic Ocean in 1912. As D. Brian Anderson has put it, the sinking of Titanic has "become a part of our mythology, firmly entrenched in the collective consciousness, and the stories will continue to be retold not because they need to be retold, but because we need to tell them." Hichens was put in charge of Lifeboat No. 6 where, according to some occupants of the boat, including socialite Margaret Brown, he refused to return to rescue people from the water due to fear of the boat being sucked into the ocean due to any suction created by the Titanic as it sank, or being swamped by desperate swimmers. He also argued with passengers throughout the night, until the boat was picked up by RMS Carpathia, and they later accused him of being drunk. Hichens went on to testify at both the American and British inquiries into the sinking, and denied the allegations made against him. == Early life == Boat No. 6 was one of fourteen clinker-built lifeboats and was located on the port side of the Titanic. Boat No. 6 was launched from the port side of Titanic at 1:10am, about an hour and a half after the liner collided with an iceberg and began sinking on 14 April 1912. Second Officer Charles Lightoller, in charge of the evacuation effort on the ship's port side, lowered the lifeboat with the assistance of Captain Edward Smith. The passengers included American socialite Margaret "Molly" Brown, as well as British lawyer Elsie Edith Bowerman and her mother Edith, American author Helen Churchill Candee, and Eloise Hughes Smith. Production began on September 1, 1995, when Cameron shot footage of the Titanic wreck. The modern scenes were shot on board the Shirshov Institute of Oceanology research vessel Akademik Mstislav Keldysh, which Cameron had used as a base when filming the wreck. Scale models, computer-generated imagery (CGI), and a reconstruction of the Titanic built at Baja Studios were used to recreate the sinking.
