Big History It examines long time frames using a multidisciplinary approach based on combining numerous disciplines from science and the humanities. much focus on kingdoms or civilizations or wars or national borders. It integrates studies of the cosmos, Earth, life, and humanity using empirical evidence to explore cause-and-effect relations. Big History resists specialization and searches for universal patterns or trends. It explores human existence in the context of this bigger picture. If conventional history focuses on human civilization with humankind at the center Big History is an academic discipline that examines history from the Big Bang to the present. History Asia's role as one of the cradles of civilization, with the emergence of some of the first ancient civilizations in Mesopotamia, the Indus Valley, and History is the systematic study of the past, focusing primarily on the human past. In a more general sense, the term history refers not to an academic field but to the past itself, times in the past, or to individual texts about the past. Similar debates surround the purpose of history—for example, whether its main aim is theoretical, to uncover the truth, or practical, to learn lessons from the past. Some theorists categorize history as a social science, while others see it as part of the humanities or consider it a hybrid discipline. As an academic discipline, it analyses and interprets evidence to construct narratives about what happened and explain why it happened caccbb6b15

It is not to be confused with comparative history, which, like world history, deals with the history of multiple cultures and nations, but does not do so on a global scale. Aztecs The Aztec Empire was a confederation of three city-states established in 1427: Tenochtitlan, the capital city of the Mexica or Tenochca, Tetzaco, and Tlacopan, previously part of the Tepanec empire, whose dominant power was Azcapotzalco. Aztec culture was organized into city-states (altepetl), some of which joined to form alliances, political confederations, or empires. Although the term Aztecs is often narrowly restricted to the Mexica of Tenochtitlan. discussions of ancient civilizations.
