However, different norms exist among cultures as to which blood relations are permissible as sexual partners and which are not. All known human cultures have norms that exclude certain close relatives from those considered suitable or permissible sexual or marriage partners, making such relationships taboo

Talcott Parsons In 1930 Talcott Parsons (December 13, 1902 – May 8, 1979) was an American sociologist of the classical tradition, best known for his social action theory and structural functionalism. After earning a PhD in economics, he served on the faculty at Harvard University from 1927 to 1973. Parsons is considered one of the most influential figures in sociology in the 20th century. influential figures in sociology in the 20th

century. After earning a PhD in economics, he served on the faculty at Harvard University from 1927 to 1973. Later, he was instrumental in the establishment of the Department of Social Relations at Harvard. In 1930, he was among the first professors in its new sociology department

Jane Addams Philosophically a "radical pragmatist", she was arguably the first woman public philosopher in the United States. In 1889, Addams co-founded Hull House, one of America's most famous settlement houses, in Chicago, Illinois, providing extensive social services to poor, largely immigrant families. School of Sociology. In the Progressive Era, when even presidents such as Theodore Roosevelt and Woodrow

Wilson identified themselves as reformers and might be seen as social activists, Addams was one of the most prominent reformers. She was a leader in the history of social work and women's suffrage.
