Qualitative methods include ethnography, grounded theory, discourse analysis, and interpretative phenomenological analysis. Qualitative research is often used to explore complex phenomena or to gain insight into people's experiences and perspectives on a particular topic. It is particularly useful when researchers want to understand the meaning that people attach to their experiences or when they want to uncover the underlying reasons for people's behavior f440865fff

Social network For instance, social network analysis has been used in studying the spread of misinformation on social media platforms or analyzing the influence of key figures in social networks. formalized in the 1950s and theories and methods of social networks became pervasive in the social and behavioral sciences by the 1980s. The study of these structures uses social network analysis to identify local and global patterns, locate influential entities, and examine dynamics of networks. The social network perspective provides a set of methods for analyzing

the structure of whole social entities along with a variety of theories explaining the patterns observed in these structures.
