The Egyptians also played an important role in developing Mediterranean maritime technology including ships and lighthouses. artificial application of water to the soil was used to some extent in ancient Egypt, a hydraulic civilization (which entails hydraulic engineering). In crop Ancient Egyptian technology describes devices and technologies invented or used in Ancient Egypt. The wheel was used for a number of purposes, but chariots only came into use after the Second Intermediate Period. They used rope trusses to stiffen the beam of ships

The utility of a capacitor depends on its capacitance. While some capacitance exists between any two electrical conductors in proximity in a circuit, a capacitor is a component designed specifically to add capacitance to some part of the circuit. The Hazen-Williams equation has the advantage that the coefficient C is not a function of the Reynolds number, but it has the disadvantage that it is only valid for water. Also, it does not account for the temperature or viscosity of the water, and therefore is only valid at room temperature and conventional velocities.
