United States Department of Defense definitions refer to a "producer phase" and a "consumer phase": b8872e70b2 Military logistics is concerned with maintaining army supply lines with food, armaments, ammunition, and spare parts, apart from the transportation of troops themselves. Civil logistics deals with acquiring, moving, and storing raw materials, semi-finished goods, and finished goods. For organisations that provide garbage collection, mail deliveries, public utilities, and after-sales services, logistical problems must be addressed.

Supplier management/sourcing b8872e70b2 == History == b8872e70b2 Around the turn of the millennium, supply chain risk management has attempted to transfer traditional risk management approaches from the "company" system to the "supply chain" system. However, the scalability of traditional risk management steps (identification, assessment, treatment and monitoring of risks) quickly reaches its limits: It is entirely possible to identify all conceivable risks within a company; However, a supply chain often consists of thousands of companies – the attempt to identify all possible risks in this system is therefore much more complex, if not in vain. It is a popular concept in contemporary supply chain management. It has therefore been argued that the complexity of supply chains requires complementary measures such as supply chain resilience. Resilience is able to cope with all sorts of changes and is thus less about the identification of specific risks but more about the characteristics of the system. b8872e70b2 In a McKinsey global survey on supply chain risk conducted in 2006, a majority of executives who responded said that they perceived "increasing risks to their ability to supply their customers with goods and services cost effectively", with "the availability of well-trained labor" posing the greatest... b8872e70b2 Logistics deals with the movement of materials or products from one facility to another; it does not include material flow within production or assembly plants, such as production planning or single-machine scheduling... b8872e70b2 == Overview == b8872e70b2 Global supply-chain management has six main areas of concentration: logistics management, competitor orientation, customer orientation, supply-chain coordination, supply management, and operations management.
