The items are selected by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology based on their "especially high historical or artistic value". The list presents 132 entries from Classical to early modern Japan, spanning from the 7th century Asuka to the 18th century Edo period. Slip (needlework) applied to a woven background fabric. Isolated In needlework, a slip is a design representing a cutting or specimen of a plant, usually with flowers or fruit and leaves on a stem. By extension, slip may also mean any embroidered or canvaswork motif, floral or not, mounted to fabric in this way. Most often, slip refers to a plant design stitched in canvaswork (pettipoint), cut out, and applied to a woven background fabric. Hand-woven blankets, treasured for their warmth and durability, often were embroidered with colorful handspun wool yarns. Hedebo embroidery The varied techniques which evolved over the next hundred years in the farming community were subsequently developed by the middle classes until around 1820. They were applied to articles of clothing such as collars and cuffs but were also used to decorate bed linen. heathland bordered by Copenhagen, Roskilde and Køge. Kutch Museum The museum was earlier known as Fergusson Museum. It is located opposite Hamirsar Lake. painted with flowers.
