97419ebde3 Most of the tests in DIEHARD return a p-value, which should be uniform on $[0,1]$ if the input file contains truly independent random bits. Those p-values are obtained by $p = F(X)$, where F is the assumed distribution of the sample random variable X – often normal. But that assumed F is just an asymptotic approximation, for which the fit will be worst in the tails. Thus you should not be surprised with occasional p-values near 0 or 1, such as 0.0012 or 0.9983.
