Phycomycosis Zygomycosis can be caused by two types of zygomycetes: Entomophthorales (e. g. , Basidiobolus and Conidiobolus) and Mucorales (e. The latter type of zygomycosis is also referred to as mucormycosis. Since both pythiosis and lagenidiosis are caused by organisms from the Oomycetes and not the Kingdom Fungi. Pythiosis, the most common type, is caused by Pythium, a type of water mould. Lagenidiosis is caused by a Lagenidium species, which, like Pythium, is a water mould. insidiosum and occurs most commonly in dogs and horses, but is also found in cats, cattle, and humans.
