Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder controversies Other areas of controversy include the use of stimulant medications in children, the method of diagnosis, and the possibility of overdiagnosis. The controversies involve clinicians, teachers, policymakers, parents, and the media. Positions range from the view that ADHD is within the normal range of behavior to the hypothesis that ADHD is a genetic condition.
