In 1560, a group of Scottish nobles known as the Lords of the Congregation gained control of government. Under their guidance, the Scottish Reformation Parliament passed legislation that established a Protestant creed, and rejected Papal supremacy, although these were only formally ratified by James VI in 1567. b06711ef94

The early Protestants and Islam established a sense of mutual tolerance and understanding, despite theological differences on Christology, considering each other to be closer to one another than to Catholicism. At the same time the Protestant Reformation was taking place in numerous Protestantism and Islam entered into contact during the early-16th century when the Ottoman Empire, expanding in the Balkans, first encountered Calvinist Protestants in present-day Hungary and Transylvania. History of Protestantism The term Protestant comes from the Protestation at Speyer in 1529, where Protestantism originated from the Protestant Reformation of the 16th century. The earliest origin of Protestantism is controversial; with some Protestants today claiming origin back to people in the early church deemed heretical such as Jovinian and Vigilantius. The term Protestant comes from the Protestation at Speyer in 1529, where the nobility protested against enforcement of the Edict of Worms which

subjected advocates of Lutheranism to forfeit all of their property. Protestantism originated from the Protestant Reformation of the 16th century. However, the theological underpinnings go back much further, as Protestant theologians of the time cited both Church Fathers and the Apostles to justify their choices and formulations b06711ef94

European wars of religion Fought after the Protestant Reformation began in 1517, the wars disrupted the religious and political order in the Catholic countries of Europe, or Christendom. intensified after the Catholic Church began the Counter-Reformation against the growth of Protestantism in 1545. Other motives during the wars involved revolt, territorial ambitions and great power conflicts. The conflicts culminated in the Thirty Years' War; The European wars of religion were a series of wars waged in Europe during the 16th, 17th and early 18th centuries. The wars were largely ended by the Peace of Westphalia (1648), which established a new political order that is now known as Westphalian sovereignty. By the end of the Thirty Years' War (1618-1648), Catholic France had allied with the Protestant forces against the Catholic Habsburg monarchy b06711ef94

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
