Robust statistics are statistics that maintain their properties even if the underlying distributional assumptions are incorrect. Robust statistical methods have been developed for many common problems, such as estimating location, scale, and regression parameters. Another motivation is to provide methods with good performance when there are small departures from a parametric distribution. One motivation is to produce statistical methods that are not unduly affected by outliers. In the simplest cases, normalization of ratings means adjusting values measured on different scales to a notionally common scale, often prior to averaging. A different approach to normalization of probability distributions is quantile normalization, where the quantiles of the different measures are brought into alignment. In

more complicated cases, normalization may refer to more sophisticated adjustments where the intention is to bring the entire probability distributions of adjusted values into alignment

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
