Lancet window Instances of this architectural element are typical of Gothic church edifices of the earliest period. It acquired the "lancet" name from its resemblance to a lance. This arch may or may not be a steep lancet arch (in which the compass centres for drawing the arch fall outside the opening). Lancet windows may occur singly, or paired under a single moulding, or grouped in an odd number with the tallest window at the centre. The Venetian window consists of an arched central light, symmetrically A Venetian window (also known as a Serlian window) is a large tripartite window which is a key element in Palladian architecture. Both the Venetian window or Serlian window and the Palladian window were inspired by Hellenistic and Roman examples which are part of the classical tradition and related to prestige and sacredness.
