

# Klezmer Clarinet

Klezmer The musical genre incorporated elements of many other musical genres including Ottoman (especially Greek and Romanian) music, Baroque music, German and Slavic folk dances, and religious Jewish music. As the music arrived in the United States, it lost some of its traditional ritual elements and adopted elements of American big band and popular music. 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“Margot Leverett and the Klezmer Mountain Boys”. Leverett later became interested in klezmer, a traditional musical style of the Jews of Eastern Europe. She studied with klezmer clarinetist Sidney Beckerman and was a founding member of The Klezmatics in 1985. Born in Ohio, she lived in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and Buffalo, New York before studying at Indiana University School of Music. The 17-track Margot Leverett is a New York City-based clarinetist. Leverett’s solo album, called The Art of Klezmer Clarinet, was released in 2001. The Klezmatics, a band associated with the Klezmer revival would later become the first klezmer band to win a Grammy Award d49dcc2b24

The Cracow Klezmer Band The group performed at Jewish Culture festivals in Hungary, Finland, Poland, Prague, and the Czech Republic. Some songs could be considered dance pieces, but there were none of the traditional Bulgars, Freylekhs or Horas. Its sound was different from what most people would consider to be traditional klezmer music — instead of danceable versions of traditional Yiddish songs, and free-form fantasies, and laments, The Cracow Klezmer Band played often dark and brooding but soulful and dynamic original virtuoso compositions instead in the klezmer form.
