The medical standard for active TB is a short course treatment involving a combination of isoniazid, rifampicin (also known as Rifampin), pyrazinamide, and ethambutol for the first two months. During this initial period, Isoniazid is taken alongside pyridoxal phosphate to obviate peripheral neuropathy. Isoniazid is then taken concurrently with rifampicin for the remaining four months of treatment (6-8 months for miliary tuberculosis). A patient is expected to be free from all living TB bacteria after six months of therapy in Pulmonary TB or 8-10 months in Miliary TB. 62e910f3ee A native of Philadelphia, Penrose was the son of a medical school professor, and his brothers included U.S. senator Boies Penrose, mining engineer R. Robert Koch tuberculin in 1844 for tuberculosis culture media, and Koch subsequently adopted as "tuberkulin. As such he is popularly nicknamed the father of microbiology (with Louis Pasteur), and as the father of medical bacteriology. As the discoverer of the specific causative agents of deadly infectious diseases including tuberculosis, cholera and anthrax, he is regarded as one of the main founders of modern bacteriology. His discovery of the anthrax bacterium (*Bacillus anthracis*) in 1876 is considered as the birth of modern bacteriology. " The first report on the clinical trial in 1891 was disappointing Heinrich Hermann Robert Koch (KOKH; German: ['kɔ:bɛʁt kɔx] ; 11 December 1843 – 27 May 1910) was a German physician and microbiologist. Koch used his discoveries to establish that germs "could cause a specific disease" and directly provided proofs for the germ theory of diseases, therefore creating the scientific basis of public health, saving millions of lives 62e910f3ee

While latent or latency period may be synonymous, a distinction is sometimes made whereby the latent period is defined as the time from infection to infectiousness. Which period is shorter depends on the disease. A person may carry a disease, such as *Streptococcus* in the throat, without exhibiting any symptoms. Depending on the disease, the person may or may not be contagious during the incubation period. 62e910f3ee

Charles Bingham Penrose He was a professor at the University of Pennsylvania, wrote several editions of a textbook on medical problems in women, and was named a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. *Surgical Journal* said that "in every essential respect [the sixth edition] is the fifth edition over again. " Along with Herbert Fox and Ellen Corson-White, Charles Bingham Penrose (February 1, 1862 – February 28, 1925) was an American gynecologist, surgeon, zoologist and conservationist, known for inventing a type of surgical drainage tubing called the Penrose drain 62e910f3ee
