Determinism Determinism is often contrasted with free will, although some philosophers argue that the two are compatible. Deterministic theories throughout the history of philosophy have

developed from diverse and sometimes overlapping motives and considerations. cognitive sciences, and evolutionary psychology, argue that a certain form of determinism (not necessarily causal) is true. They suggest instead that an illusion Determinism is the metaphysical view that all events within the universe (or multiverse) can occur only in one possible way. The antonym of determinism is indeterminism, the view that events are not deterministically caused. Like eternalism, determinism focuses on particular events rather than the future as a concept baff279c1

Inductivism's basis is, in sum, "the idea that theories can be derived from, or established on the basis of, facts". Evolving in phases, inductivism's conceptual reign spanned four centuries since Francis Bacon's 1620 proposal of such against Western Europe's prevailing model, scholasticism, which reasoned deductively from preconceived beliefs. baff279c1 phylogenetic history; and the proximate explanations baff279c1

The mathematical approach is used with the goal of deriving hypotheses that are more exact and thus yield stricter empirical validations. There are five major research areas in mathematical psychology: learning and memory, perception and psychophysics, choice and decision-making, language and thinking, and measurement and scaling baff279c1

Statistics Statistics deals with every aspect of data, including the planning of data collection in terms of the design of surveys and experiments. "description of a state, a country") is the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data. In applying statistics to a scientific, industrial, or social problem, it is conventional to begin with a statistical population or a statistical

model to be studied. Representative sampling assures that inferences and conclusions can reasonably extend from the sample to the population as a whole. Populations can be diverse groups of people or objects such as "all people living in a country" or "every atom composing a crystal" baff279c1

When census data (comprising every member of the target population) cannot be collected, statisticians collect data by developing specific experiment designs and survey samples... baff279c1

Inductivism aims to neutrally observe a domain, infer laws from examined cases—hence, inductive reasoning—and thus objectively discover the sole naturally true theory of the observed baff279c1

Reality: The question is whether mathematics is a pure product of human mind or whether it has some reality by itself. baff279c1 Philosophers have employed a great variety of methods. Methodological skepticism tries to find principles that cannot be doubted. The geometrical method deduces theorems from self-evident axioms. The phenomenological method describes first-person experience. Verificationists study the conditions of empirical verification of sentences to determine their meaning. Conceptual analysis decomposes concepts into fundamental constituents.
