Escapement At the same time. An escapement is a mechanical linkage in mechanical watches and clocks that gives impulses to the timekeeping element and periodically releases the gear An escapement is a mechanical linkage in mechanical watches and clocks that gives impulses to the timekeeping element and periodically releases the gear train to move forward, advancing the clock's hands. Each swing of the pendulum or balance wheel releases a tooth of the escapement's escape wheel, allowing the clock's gear train to advance or "escape" by a fixed amount. This regular periodic advancement moves the clock's hands forward at a steady rate. The escapement is driven by force from a coiled spring or a suspended weight, transmitted through the timepiece's gear train. The impulse action transfers energy to the clock's timekeeping element (usually a pendulum or balance wheel) to replace the energy lost to friction during its cycle and keep the timekeeper oscillating 4f7a26c4d1

For a long time, medical recipes were written in Latin, often using special symbols to denote weights. The apothecaries' system of measures is a similar system of volume units based on the fluid ounce. The English version of the system is closely related to the English troy system of weights, the pound and grain being exactly the same in both. It divides a pound into 12 ounces, an ounce into 8 drachms, and a drachm into 3 scruples of 20 grains each 4f7a26c4d1

Comparison of analog and digital recording) For electronic audio signals, sources of noise include mechanical, electrical and thermal noise in the recording Sound can be recorded and stored and played using either digital or analog techniques. Arguments for analog systems include the absence of fundamental error mechanisms which are present in digital audio systems, including aliasing and associated anti-aliasing filter implementation, jitter and quantization noise. Musicians and listeners have argued over the superiority of digital versus analog sound recordings. Both techniques introduce errors and distortions in the sound, and these methods can be systematically compared. Advocates of digital point to the high levels of performance possible with digital audio, including excellent linearity in the audible band and low levels of noise and distortion.
