Methodology is the study of research methods. However, the term can also refer to the methods themselves or to the philosophical discussion of associated background assumptions. This normally involves various steps, like choosing a sample, collecting data from this sample, and interpreting the data. However, the term can also refer to the methods themselves or to the philosophical discussion of associated background. In its most common sense, methodology is the study of research methods. These descriptions and evaluations depend on philosophical background assumptions. A method is a structured procedure for bringing about a certain goal, like acquiring knowledge or verifying knowledge claims. The study of methods concerns a detailed description and analysis of these processes. This way, it is assessed what advantages and disadvantages they have and for what research goals they may be used. It includes evaluative aspects by comparing different methods

Qualitative designs emphasize understanding of social phenomena through direct observation, communication with participants, or analyses of texts, and may stress contextual subjective accuracy over generality.

Mixed methods research is more specific in that it includes the mixing of qualitative and quantitative data, methods, methodologies, and/or paradigms in a research study or set of related studies. Scientific method Scientific inquiry includes creating a testable hypothesis through inductive reasoning, testing it through experiments and statistical analysis, and adjusting or discarding the hypothesis based on the results. Not all steps take place The scientific method is an empirical method for acquiring knowledge that has been referred to while doing science since at least the 17th century. Historically, it was developed through the centuries from the ancient and medieval world. While the scientific method is often presented as a fixed sequence of steps, it actually represents a set of general principles. The scientific method involves careful observation coupled with rigorous skepticism, because cognitive assumptions can distort the interpretation of the observation 0b53d8c3a6
