History of science they brought with them a great deal of classical learning including an understanding of botany, medicine, and zoology. Protoscience, early sciences, and natural philosophies such as alchemy and astrology that existed during the Bronze Age, Iron Age, classical antiquity and the Middle Ages, declined during the early modern period after the establishment of formal disciplines of science in the Age of Enlightenment. Igreja de São Roque Igreja de São Roque was one of the few buildings in Lisbon to survive the earthquake relatively unscathed. The edifice served as the Society's home church in Portugal for over 200 years, before the Jesuits were expelled from that country. It remains a part of the Holy House of Mercy today, one of its many heritage buildings. After the 1755 Lisbon earthquake, the church and its ancillary residence were given to the Lisbon Holy House of Mercy to replace their church and headquarters which had been destroyed. Branches of science The term does The branches of science, also referred to as sciences, scientific fields or scientific disciplines, are commonly divided into three major groups:. transdisciplinary study of systems in general, to elucidate principles that can be applied to all types of systems in all fields of research 888f84a3f8

Formal sciences: the study of formal systems, such as those under the branches of logic and mathematics, which use an a priori, as opposed to empirical, methodology. Water is an important feature of many gardens, as are rocks and often gravel. Plants and worn, aged materials are generally used by Japanese garden designers to suggest a natural landscape, and to express the fragility of existence as well as time's unstoppable advance. Despite there being many attractive Japanese flowering plants, herbaceous flowers generally play much less of a role in Japanese gardens than in the West, though seasonally flowering shrubs and trees are important, all the more dramatic because of the contrast with the 888f84a3f8

Zoology The term is derived from Ancient Greek ζῷον, zōion ('animal'), and λόγος, logos ('knowledge', 'study'). Zoology is one of the primary branches of biology. Rudimentary botanical science began with empirically based plant lore passed from generation to generation in the oral traditions of Paleolithic hunter-gatherers. The first writings that show human curiosity about plants themselves, rather than the uses that could be made of them, appear in ancient Greece and ancient India. In Ancient Greece, the teachings of Aristotle's student Theophrastus at the Lyceum in ancient Athens in about 350 BC are considered the starting point for Western botany. Augustin Pyramus de Candolle Although de Candolle's main focus was botany, he also contributed to related fields such as phytogeography, agronomy, paleontology, medical botany, and economic botany. Within a couple of years de Candolle had established a new genus, and he went on to document hundreds of plant families and create a new natural plant classification system.
