Underground Railroad It ran north and grew steadily until President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863. However, a network of safe houses generally known as the Underground Railroad began to organize in the 1780s among Abolitionist Societies in the North. for freedom and to sign up to fight in the Union Army.
