Variation of parameters extends to linear partial differential equations as well, specifically to inhomogeneous problems for linear evolution equations like the heat equation, wave equation, and vibrating plate equation. In this setting, the method is more often known as Duhamel's principle, named after Jean-Marie Duhamel... A first order differential equation is said to be homogeneous if it may be written $y'(x) + p(x)y = 0$. The solutions to the differential equation are a family of functions. Graphically, this can be plotted in the phase plane like a two-dimensional vector field. Vectors representing the derivatives of the points with respect to a parameter (say time t), that is $(dx/dt, dy/dt)$, at representative points (x, y) in the phase plane, are shown in the figure. The vector field is tangent to the solution curves.
