Climate migration Gradual shifts in the environment tend to impact more people than sudden disasters. to undertake due to climate-related challenges. Varying levels of investment are made in supporting the adaptation, resilience, and mobility of neighborhoods

Climate migration is a subset of climate-related mobility that refers to movement driven by the impact of sudden or gradual climate-exacerbated disasters, such as "abnormally heavy rainfalls, prolonged droughts, desertification, environmental degradation, or sea-level rise and cyclones". The majority of climate migrants move internally within their own countries, though a smaller number of climate-displaced people also move across national borders

Higher levels of vulnerability will be found in densely populated areas, in particular those affected by poverty, poor governance... Public opinion polling is an important part of studying climate communication and how to improve climate action. Evidence of public opinion can help increase commitment to act by decision makers. Surveys and polling to assess opinion have been done since the 1980s, first focusing on awareness, but gradually including greater detail about commitments to climate action. More recently, global surveys give much finer data, for example, in January 2021...

Climate change denial Several studies have analyzed these positions. To a lesser extent, climate change denial can also be implicit when people accept the science but fail to reconcile it with their belief or action. Climate change denial includes unreasonable doubts about the extent to which climate change is caused by humans, its effects on nature and human society, and the potential of adaptation to global warming by human actions. Those promoting Climate change denial (also global warming denial) is a form of science denial characterized by rejecting, refusing to acknowledge, disputing, or fighting the scientific consensus on climate change which exists due to extensive and diverse empirical evidence. An economic analysis of climate change uses economic tools and models to calculate the magnitude and distribution of damages caused by climate change. It can also give guidance for the best policies for mitigation and adaptation to climate change from an economic perspective. For example, in a cost-benefit analysis, the trade offs between climate change impacts, adaptation, and mitigation are made explicit. There are many economic models and frameworks. Those models link main features of society and economy with the biosphere and atmosphere into one modelling framework. For this kind of analysis, integrated assessment models (IAMs) are useful.
