Urban flooding The IPCC summarized the current research regarding economic impacts as follows (as Urban flooding is the inundation of land or property in cities or other built environment,

caused by rainfall or coastal storm surges overwhelming the capacity of drainage systems, such as storm sewers. Urban flooding can occur regardless of whether or not affected communities are located within designated floodplains or near any body of water. Traffic congestion can be worsened by urban flood events. During the flood, stormwater or water released from damaged water mains may accumulate on property and in public rights-of-way. transportation systems. It is triggered for example by an overflow of rivers and lakes, flash flooding or snowmelt. It can seep through building walls and floors, or backup into buildings through sewer pipes, cellars, toilets and sinks

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Extended producer responsibility

Emissions data are reported to the IPCC as contributions of producing industries located in a particular country. Extended producer responsibility (EPR) is a strategy to add all of the estimated environmental costs associated with a product throughout the product life cycle to the market price of that product, contemporarily mainly applied in the field of waste management. responsibility for greenhouse gas emissions.
