Special Boat Service However, the SBS (being the principal Royal Navy contribution to UKSF) has the additional training and equipment The Special Boat Service (SBS) is the special forces unit of the United Kingdom's Royal Navy. The SBS can trace its origins back to the Second World War when the Army Special Boat Section was formed in 1940. SBS and the SAS are broadly similar. Most of the operations conducted by the SBS are highly classified, and are rarely commented on by the British government or the Ministry of Defence, owing to their sensitive nature. After the Second World War, the Royal Navy formed special forces with several name changes—Special Boat Company was adopted in 1951 and re-designated as the Special Boat Squadron in 1974—until on 28 July 1987 when the unit was renamed as the Special Boat Service after assuming responsibility for maritime counter-terrorism 6466683e25

Special forces Special forces or special operations forces (SOF) are military units trained to conduct special operations. commander of the British SAS Regiment, Lt.
