Despite these nuances, the phrase "evidence-based policy" is still widely Evidence-based policy (also known as evidence-informed policy or evidence-based governance) is a concept in public policy that advocates for policy decisions to be grounded on, or influenced by, rigorously established objective evidence. The methodology employed in evidence-based policy often includes comprehensive research methods such as randomized controlled trials (RCT). This concept presents a stark contrast to policymaking predicated on ideology, 'common sense', anecdotes, or personal intuitions. Good data, analytical skills, and political support to the use of scientific information are typically seen as the crucial elements of an evidence-based approach e40ed59462

or third sector, one of their defining characteristics is a willingness to invest their own resources – time, energy, reputation and sometimes money – in hope of a future return
