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of theories that aim to account for differences in individuals' learning. they form a learning cycle from experience to observation to conceptualization to experimentation and back to experience. A common concept is that individuals differ in how they learn. Although there is ample evidence that individuals express personal preferences on how they prefer to receive information, few studies have found validity in using learning styles in education. Many theories share the proposition that humans can be classified according to their "style" of learning, but differ on how the proposed styles should be defined, categorized and assessed

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
