**Zoo hypothesis** In the zoo hypothesis, no contact would be possible until humanity had acquired a certain level of civilization and maturity. The zoo hypothesis speculates on the assumed behavior and existence of technologically advanced extraterrestrial life and the reasons they refrain from contacting Earth. The hypothesis states that extraterrestrial life intentionally avoids communication with Earth to allow for natural evolution and sociocultural development, and avoiding interplanetary contamination, similar to people observing animals at a zoo. It is one of many theoretical explanations for the Fermi paradox. solutions to the Fermi paradox). **Mathematical universe hypothesis** In physics and cosmology, the mathematical universe hypothesis (MUH), also known as the ultimate ensemble theory, is a speculative "theory of everything" In physics and cosmology, the mathematical universe hypothesis (MUH), also known as the ultimate ensemble theory, is a speculative "theory of everything" (TOE) proposed by cosmologist Max Tegmark. Tegmark extends this idea to hypothesize that all mathematical objects exist, which he describes as a form of Platonism or Modal realism. According to the hypothesis, the universe is a mathematical object in and of itself cef42b6996

The idea was named after the title of an 1857 book, *Omphalos* by Philip Henry Gosse, in which Gosse argued that for the world to be "functional", God must have created the Earth with... cef42b6996 If a hypothesis is repeatedly independently demonstrated by experiment to be true, it becomes a scientific theory. While hypothesis testing was popularized early A statistical hypothesis test is a method of statistical inference used to decide whether the data provide sufficient evidence to reject a particular hypothesis. Then a decision is made, either by comparing the test statistic to a critical value or equivalently by evaluating a p-value computed from the test statistic. **Omphalos hypothesis** It is based on the religious belief that the universe was created by a divine being, within the past six to ten thousand years (in keeping with flood geology), and that the presence of objective, verifiable evidence that the universe is older than approximately ten millennia is due to the creator introducing false evidence that makes the universe appear significantly older. **Comparator hypothesis** If for example in classical conditioning The comparator hypothesis is a psychological model of associative learning and performance. To understand the model, it helps to consider how associative learning is usually studied. For example, to study the learning of an association between cues, such as lights and sounds, and an outcome such as food, an experimenter typically pairs the cues and the food a number of times (the learning phase) and then tests with one or more of the cues to see if a response has been learned (the test phase). happens during the test phase. The comparator hypothesis assumes, on the contrary, that what happens during the learning phase is fairly simple, and that. Most theories of associative learning have assumed that phenomena of interest (see Classical conditioning for a list of phenomena) depend on what happens during the learning phase. Null hypothesis A one-tailed hypothesis (tested using The null hypothesis (often denoted  $H_0$ ) is the claim in scientific research that the effect being studied does not exist. In contrast with the null hypothesis, an alternative hypothesis (often denoted  $H_A$  or  $H_1$ ) is developed, which claims that a relationship does exist between two variables. Examples:  $\mu \leq 100$ ;  $95 \leq \mu \leq 105$ . Fisher required an exact null hypothesis for testing (see the quotations below). The null hypothesis can also be described as the hypothesis in which no relationship exists between two sets of data or variables being analyzed. If the null hypothesis is true, any experimentally observed effect is due to chance alone, hence the term "null" cef42b6996

Sequential analysis Instead data is evaluated as it is collected, and further In statistics, sequential analysis or sequential hypothesis testing is statistical analysis where the sample size is not fixed in advance. Thus a conclusion may sometimes be reached at a much earlier stage than would be possible with more classical hypothesis testing or estimation, at consequently lower financial and/or human cost. Instead data is evaluated as it is collected, and further sampling is stopped in accordance with a pre-defined stopping rule as soon as significant results are observed. sequential hypothesis testing is statistical analysis where the sample size is not fixed in advance cef42b6996

The hypothesis has proven controversial. Jürgen Schmidhuber argues that it is not possible to assign an equal weight or probability to all mathematical objects a priori due to there being infinitely many of them. Physicists Piet Hut and Mark Alford have suggested that the idea is incompatible with Gödel's first incompleteness theorem. cef42b6996

Riemann hypothesis It is of great interest in number theory because it implies results about the distribution of prime numbers. It was proposed by Bernhard Riemann (1859), after whom it is named. The name is also used for some closely related analogues, such as the Riemann hypothesis for curves over finite In mathematics, the Riemann hypothesis is the conjecture that the Riemann zeta function has its zeros only at the negative even integers and complex numbers with real part  $1/2$ .
