Turing test The power and appeal of the Turing test derives from its simplicity. In the test, a human evaluator judges a text transcript of a natural-language conversation between a human and a machine. The results would not depend on the machine's ability to answer questions correctly, only on how closely its answers resembled those of a human. Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability in performance capacity, the verbal version generalizes naturally to all of

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human performance capacity, verbal as well as nonverbal (robotic). involved. The evaluator tries to identify the machine, and the machine passes if the evaluator cannot reliably tell them apart.
