Electron ionization Local anesthesia is widely used but sometimes these drugs can cause medical accidents. In such cases an accurate, simple, and rapid Electron ionization (EI, formerly known as electron impact ionization and electron bombardment ionization) is an ionization method in which energetic electrons interact with solid or gas phase atoms or molecules to produce ions. This technique is considered a hard (high fragmentation) ionization method, since it uses highly energetic electrons to produce ions. However, this method is still a popular ionization technique. This leads to extensive fragmentation, which can be helpful for structure determination of unknown compounds. EI was one of the first ionization techniques developed for mass spectrometry. monitoring (GC-MS-EI-SIM). Also, several other thermally stable and volatile compounds in solid, liquid and gas states can be. EI is the most useful for organic compounds which have a molecular weight below 600 amu

Oxygen therapy It may also be prophylactically given to maintain blood oxygen levels during the induction of anesthesia. It can also be given through bypassing the airway, such as in ECMO therapy. Oxygen can be delivered via nasal cannula, face mask, or endotracheal intubation at normal atmospheric pressure, or in a hyperbaric chamber. Supplemental oxygen can also refer to the use of oxygen enriched air at altitude. Acute indications for therapy include hypoxemia (low blood oxygen levels), carbon monoxide toxicity and cluster headache

Breathing gas Oxygen is required by people for normal cell metabolism A breathing gas is a mixture of gaseous chemical elements and compounds used for respiration. Medical use of breathing gases other than air include oxygen therapy and anesthesia applications. Breathing gases for hyperbaric use have been developed to improve on the performance of ordinary air by reducing the risk of decompression sickness, reducing the duration of decompression, reducing nitrogen narcosis or reducing work of breathing and allowing safer deep diving. Air is the most common and only natural breathing gas, but other mixtures of gases, or pure oxygen, are also used in breathing equipment and enclosed habitats.

Exophthalmos has endocrine causes. In the case of Graves' disease, the displacement of the eye results from abnormal connective tissue deposition in the orbit and extraocular muscles, which can be visualized by CT or MRI. Symptoms of CNM include severe hypotonia, hypoxia-requiring breathing assistance, and scaphocephaly. Among centronuclear myopathies, the X-linked myotubular myopathy form typically presents at birth, and is thus considered a congenital myopathy. However, some centronuclear myopathies may present later in life. Methylene blue was first prepared in 1876, by Heinrich Caro. It is on the World Health Organization's List of Essential Medicines.
