The invention of a practical, efficient transformer made AC power distribution feasible; a system using distribution transformers was demonstrated as early as 1882

In North America, standard household circuits for lighting and small appliances... The autotransformer winding has at least three electrical connections to the winding. Since part of the winding does "double duty", autotransformers have the advantages of often being smaller, lighter, and cheaper than typical dual-winding transformers, but the disadvantage of not providing electrical isolation between primary and secondary... If mounted on a utility pole, they are called pole-mount transformers. When placed either at ground level or underground, distribution transformers are mounted on concrete pads and locked in steel cases, thus known as distribution tap pad-mounted transformers. Split-phase distribution is widely used in North America for residential and light commercial service. A typical installation supplies two 120 V AC lines that are 180 degrees out of phase with each other (relative to the neutral), along with a shared neutral conductor. The neutral is connected to ground at the transformer's center tap.

Power factor Where apparent power exceeds real power, more current is flowing in the circuit than would be required to transfer real power. In electrical engineering, the power factor of an AC power system is defined as the ratio of the real power absorbed by the load to the apparent power flowing in the circuit. Apparent power is often higher than real power because energy is cyclically accumulated in the load and returned to the source or because a non-linear load distorts the wave shape of the current. Apparent power is the product of root mean square (RMS) current and voltage. Real power is the average of the instantaneous product of voltage and current and represents the capacity of the electricity for performing work. Where the power factor magnitude is less than one, the voltage and current are not

Efficient long-distance transmission of electric power requires high voltages. This reduces the losses produced by strong currents. Transmission lines use either alternating current (AC) or direct current (DC). The voltage level is changed with transformers. The voltage is stepped up for transmission, then...

Electric power distribution The bus distributes power to distribution Electric power distribution is the final stage in the delivery of electricity. Often several customers are supplied from one transformer through secondary distribution lines. Commercial and residential customers are connected to the secondary distribution lines through service drops. Distribution substations connect to the transmission system and lower the transmission voltage to medium voltage ranging between 2 kV and 33 kV with the use of transformers. Primary distribution lines carry this medium voltage power to distribution transformers located near the customer's premises. Distribution transformers again lower the voltage to the utilization voltage used by lighting, industrial equipment and household appliances. From the transformer, power goes to the busbar that can split the distribution power off in multiple directions. Electricity is carried from the transmission system to individual consumers

Transformer types common type of transformer, widely used in electric power transmission and appliances to convert mains voltage to low voltage to power electronic devices Various types of electrical transformer are made for different purposes. Despite their design differences, the various types employ the same basic principle as discovered in 1831 by Michael Faraday, and share several key functional parts

Electric power transmission This is distinct from the local wiring between high-voltage substations and customers, which is typically referred to as electric power distribution. The interconnected lines that facilitate this movement form a transmission network. The combined transmission and distribution network is part of electricity delivery, known as the electrical grid. Electric power transmission is the bulk movement of electrical energy from a generating site, such as a power plant, to an electrical substation. In a three-phase system, each of the three voltages is offset by 120 degrees of phase shift relative to the others. This arrangement produces a more constant flow of power compared with single-phase systems, making it especially efficient for transmitting electricity over long distances and for powering heavy loads such as industrial machinery. Because it is an AC system, voltages can be easily increased or decreased with transformers, allowing high-voltage...

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
